Wages

The CEG chair was appointed June 2018 by WWU. Together, WWU and the CEG chair appointed the remaining 8 members in September 2018.

The wages for the members were agreed at £30,000 for the CEG chair, and £10,000 for the CEG members per year (divided between direct wages and payment to a company the representative worked for) for a monthly meeting, excluding:

- Victoria Pelka, the representative from Citizens advice, did not receive any wage for her contribution as agreed with Citizens Advice.
- Adam Scorer replaced Danni Crossland in December 2018 but the CEG contract was with NEA to supply a representative, therefore there was no change to the framework.

Travel

CEG members were chosen to represent different members of our local communities, therefore travel was required for several of our members.

Excluding the expenses claimed via a framework, the total cost of travel (Train and taxis) has been totalled at £6.414.48.

Hotel stays

As per the above, due to the travel involved for several CEG members, hotel rooms were booked for those that required.

This totalled £4,716.87 across 16 meetings, for 3 - 6 members at a time, averaging at about £65.50 per room per night.

Printing and other expenses

The fourth highest expenditure of the CEG was printing. This includes printing of business plans, workbooks, presentations etc that all contributed to the monthly meeting. This totalled £1,963.23 for the year, an average of £122.70 per meeting.

The remaining minor expenses include:

- Food (£402.70)
- Editing and upload of CEG bios to the Wales & West Utilities website (£400)
- Photographer for the headshots of the CEG members included on the Wales & West Utilities website (£196)
