| Problem                          | <ul> <li>People with sensory loss do not have access to specialist equipment, information, or advice on Carbon Monoxide in a way that is accessible and meets their needs.</li> <li>People who are deaf are particularly affected due to sound-based alarm systems being most commonly used. More work is needed to protect older people with sensory loss from Carbon Monoxide (CO).</li> </ul>   |
|                                  | Wales & West Utilities will look to extend this<br>successful partnership with Care and Repair<br>Cymru, which began in RIIO GD1, and looked to<br>raise awareness of the dangers of CO with over<br>60's in Wales, whilst making referrals the<br>Priority Service Register (PSR); and look to<br>incorporate further work to identify meaningful<br>solutions for people experiencing sensory loss.  |
| Scope and Objectives             | This project is ready to commence via specialist<br>Managing Better caseworkers, who are<br>specially trained to offer information and<br>advice to help assist people living with sensory<br>loss aged over 50 across Wales to live<br>independently at home. Last year, Managing<br>Better helped 2,265 people in Wales and in<br>2021 the service won Alzheimer's Society's<br>Dementia Friendly Diversity Award in<br>recognition of the methods we use to deliver<br>Managing Better. |
|                                  | We will offer carbon monoxide monitors and<br>PSR sign ups to all Managing Better clients, and<br>ensure they understand how to use the<br>monitor, and what to do if the alarm goes off or  |

These resources will be used in<br/>homes across Wales within the Care &amp;<br/>Repair network and will be shared with<br/>our Managing Better project partners<br/>(detailed below), further expanding<br/>WWU reach via these new specialist<br/>materials.</li> <li>An awareness campaign using these<br/>materials, with our Managing Better<br/>partners.</li> </ul> |
| Expected outcomes and the associated actions. | <ul> <li>We will integrate conversations on<br/>carbon monoxide and gas safety into all<br/>home visits with our Managing Better<br/>clients. Between April 2020 and March<br/>2021, this was 2,265 people. This year<br/>has seen increased demand for the<br/>service.</li> </ul>  |
|   | <ul> <li>Improve home (gas) safety for people<br/>in Wales living with sensory loss<br/>through CO monitor fitting and<br/>awareness raising during our home<br/>visits and telephone assessments</li> <li>Improve health and wellbeing for<br/>Wales' most vulnerable older people</li> </ul>   |
