Total VCMA funding required (£k)	£85,000
Problem	Care and Repair Cymru (CRC) have operated the 70+ Cymru Project across the whole of Wales since October 2020. During this time, they have dealt with and come through, project inception and set up, Project Manager and Home Energy Officer recruitment, training and system and processes set up. Over the last 6 months they have accelerated service delivery during a period when the price cap increased, energy costs soared, and a cost-of-living crisis had started.  Just at the point where they are operating most
	efficiently, when fixed tariffs end, and the second energy cap occurs, and they enter the coldest months of winter, the Project is due to end.
	Wales & West Utilities will fund the project for the four remaining months of the 2022/23 regulatory year as fuel poverty is increasing across Wales:
	2019: 155,000 households, 130,000 householders aged 60+

Scope and Objectives	The objectives will be for the Project Manager and 8 Home Energy Officers (6 FTEs) to continue to reach over 60s most in need of this support, as energy costs escalate and fixed rate tariffs for many vulnerable older people end.  Without this £85K funding, Care & Repair Cymru would have to end this Wales wide support, just as the cold weather arrives, and
	people need help most.  The services being delivered as part of this project include:  • Income maximisation support through

Scale of VCMA project and SROI calculations	We have taken the forecasted numbers expected by CRC for the four-month delivery period and calculated the following SROI over a 5-year period:  Total Gross Present Value = 33,554,769.37  Net Present Value = £3,469,769.37  SROI per £1 spent = £40.82
Project Partners and third parties involved	This project will be delivered in partnership by Wales & West Utilities, and Care and Repair Cymru.
VCMA Project start and end date	The project will begin under the VCMA on 1 December 2022 and run until 31 March 2023.
Geographical area	The project will be delivered all over Wales.
