Key Accountabilities	 Assist in the assessment of emerging or updated HS&E legislation; review, amend or create HS&E procedures as required to meet continued compliance. Assist with communicating the impact to operations and the wider business. Undertake active monitoring (to include hazard spotting, inspections and audits) of site management and working practices to help ensure the delivery of continual improvement in health, safety and environmental performance. Ensuring compliance with company HS&E policy and procedures Support and promote WWU's behavioural safety initiative, influencing the culture of the workforce by coaching to improve their safety performance whilst promoting health and wellbeing Undertake accident and/or incident investigation, producing detailed report which identify immediate and underlying causes, offering recommendations for action to ensure compliance with HS&E legislation, guidance and WWU policy and procedures. Support the ongoing HS&E support and advice during all stages of projects (inc. pre-tender, tender issue, pre-start, project progress and post completion) to help drive continual improvement in WWU and contractor HS&E performance. Support the application of near miss/accident/incident reporting, including the investigation, communication and close out of lessons learned.
